# Florida Woodturning Symposium

Due to a layoff, I had time to visit relatives and go to the Florida Woodturning Symposium. The symposium has been an annual January event, held about a 45 minute drive northwest of Orlando ,at a Lake Yale Baptist Convention Center. It is a nice facility, which remided me of a camp, but the food was crappy. Everything else was a good time. It gets started at lunchtime Friday goes into the evenings and finishes on Sunday with lunch.

The demonstrators were **Paul Pouliot, Larry Friedrich, Tony Cortese, Ron Browning, Al Stirt, Andi Wolfe, Binh Pho, and Stuart Batty.** There were 8 rotations throughout the weekend, 4 at a time and several hands-on workshops Friday.

Friday evening was a "Florida turn-a-round" competition, where a three-person team had 15 minutes each to turn a lidded box, to look as identical as possible ,to the others on their team. The project is unknown before hand and each team has 5 minutes to plan before the chips start flying.

During the competition, in the same room, an Instant gallery critique was being done by Lyle Jamison and another turner, who's name I am sorry I didn't get. It was very insightful to see how others look at the many people's works and point out interesting details, likes and dislikes.

Saturday evening had raffles and auction items.

There was a good mix of tools for sale. Also, a lot of Australian woods were available and a good price on some domestic wood.

Of the demonstrators I went to, I was most impressed by Andi Wolfe and Binh Pho. It seemed a little ironic as they both paint their turnings and I typically don't like painted wood. They both mostly use clear paints, so they can blend color by layers of different color or shades and some grain shows through. Their styles are quite different

Andi typically does bowls with tree leaves or carves out the leaves as if swirling in the wind. Andi Wolfe is a botanist from Ohio State University and got a ribbing about a recent college game. (Loss to Florida Gators in one of them bowl games). She taught us about the cells/fibers in a tree and their function in a growing and aging tree, which gave insight on colour of wood and why and how wood grain itself varies.

Binh Pho typically does a very thin wall tall half torpedo like vase shape with his distinct airbrush painting and piercing. Much time is put into taping off sections and then applies various paints and colors. Most of his pieces represent events in his life as a Vietnamese. He missed being on the last helicopter when the U.S. left Vietnam. He told us tales of how he finally escaped, after four attempts, from the communist prison (reeducation camp), and other stories of his life.

For next year's symposium, start checking their web site in June, as the hands-on sessions fill up quick.





