At November's meeting, Mike Foydel shared with us his tecniques on making Christmas ornaments. He showed how he drilled the entry and perch holes, roughed the blank, turned the birdhouse base, roof and finial, sanded and finished it, and put the eye bolt in to hang it from.

He also showed other varieties of ornaments he made. Some were segmented, inside out, as well as plexiglass tube with base and roof.


