





Jennifer Shirley's Demo on May 12th from 9 am until 4 pm including lunch. Note that this is a Wednesday.

Jennifer is the recipient of an Educational Grant from The American Association of Woodturners, a studio assistant and instructor at Marc Adams School of Woodworking in Franklin, Indiana and an instructor at the Anderson Ranch in Colorado.

Some of the item she will do is to demo several projects such as a small wall mirror, or a small flower holder that utilizes a flower frog that holds fresh flowers.

She would then demonstrate decorating these items and really get into surface enhancements and decorating objects.

She will demo wood burning and the different burners available; talk about

making your own burning pens.

Her demo may also include some simple carving with rolled inks and using different tools to create texture and random effects in wood.

The demo may include the use of milk paints over texture, and carving textures that are then filled with different materials to give a really neat effect. She will also introduce the use of different friskits and resists. These are materials used to mask off parts of the wood in order to create a texture or color on the parts that aren't. Plus much more.

- Topics covered
 - Turquoise Chips Real Stone
 - Veneer Strips Real Wood
 - InLace Woodturners Bondo

Turquoise

3

- Different shades from different mines
- Buy 1 oz. bags for \$10/bag
- Fill groove with chips and CA thin glue
- Very hard, grind to shape with Dremel
- Polishes to high luster
- Cost is about 40 cents/in.- 1/8" groove



4

- Readily available in many designs
- Install in circumferential groove with CA
- Make groove width tight fit with strip
- Install with part on lathe in short sections. CA in Groove - Accel. on strip
- Careful strip is fragile, sand only
- Cost is about 25 cents/in.

InLace

5

- Acetone based resin with many available additives for color & texture
- Additives are Granules, Nuggets, Stone Flakes, Metallic Dusts & Solid Color and Pearlescent Dyes
- Hardener is MEK
- Must work in ventilated area



6

- Recommend that you start with Kit seven colors available - \$24/Kit
- Start on flat surface for experience
- Make groove 1/8" deep minimum
- 15 minutes working time after hardener
- 12 hour cure time
- Messy and sticky stuff

- InLace machines & polishes like wood
- Skew flat on tool rest
- Beall system for final polishing
- Cost is 5 cents/inch for 1/8 x 1/8 groove


